MENTAL HEALTH WEEK OBSERVANCES 2025

- 1. In support of Republic Act No. 11036 (Mental Health Act) and DepEd Memorandum No. 074, s. 2021, the Schools Division of Aklan shall observe National Mental Health Week from October 6 to 10, 2025, as part of the broader month-long celebration of National Mental Health Month. This year's global theme, "Community: Supporting Mental Wellbeing Together," emphasizes the vital role of supportive communities in promoting resilience, shared understanding, and emotional wellbeing. The observance aims to:
 - a. Raise awareness on the importance of mental health;
 - b. Strengthen school-based support systems through learner-centered activities; and
 - c. Foster a sense of community and shared responsibility for mental wellness.
- 2. Schools are encouraged to sustain mental health initiatives year-round, integrating the theme into classroom discussions, wellness activities, and community engagement efforts. Age-appropriate activities that reflect the theme may include but not limited to the following:
 - a. Mental Health Literacy Sessions (e.g., classroom integration, homeroom guidance);
 - b. Art for Wellness (e.g., poster-making, journaling, spoken word);
 - c. Mindful Movement Activities (e.g., stretching, breathing exercises);
 - d. Mental Health Corners and Suggestion Boxes;
 - e. Home Environment, Education/Employment, Eating and Exercise, Activities, Drugs/Substances, Sex, Suicidality/Depression, And Safety Assessment; and





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- f. Mental health break in the green/mental health spaces for learners.
- 3. School heads shall assign a Mental Health Focal Person to oversee activities. A Narrative Report with MOVs (photos, attendance, reflections) shall be submitted to the district nurse-in-charge and/or Mental Health District focal person for consolidation and submission to SGOD School Health and Nutrition Unit on or before October 31, 2025 through https://bit.ly/Mental-Health-Week-Observances-2025.
- Widest and immediate dissemination of and strict compliance with this Memorandum is desired.

INCLUSION AND PROMOTION OF MENTAL HEALTH IN ALL DEPED EVENTS AND PROGRAMS

Undersecretaries To: Assistant Secretaries Minister, Basic, Higher, and Technical Education, BARMM Bureau and Service Directors Regional Directors Schools Division Superintendents Public and Private Elementary and Secondary School Heads All Others Concerned

- The COVID-19 pandemic has posed unprecedented challenges to the education sector.
- 2. The rising number of cases and presence of community transmissions have not only hampered physical classes, but also brought about mental and psychological distress to the learners and personnel of the Department of Education (DepEd) and its stakeholders.
- 3. DepEd prioritizes the promotion and protection of the mental health and general welfare of its personnel and learners, especially in this time of crisis. DepEd Order No. 14, s. 2020 titled Guidance on the Required Health Standards in Basic Education Offices and Schools highlights this priority through the provision of Mental Health and Psychosocial Support Services (MHPSS) to improve and strengthen the mental resilience of all learners and DepEd personnel.
- The provision of MHPSS entails access to different helplines for mental health. In this regard, all DepEd offices are instructed to include and promote the enclosed poster provided by the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Service (DRRMS) in all events and programs.
- As the pandemic continues to challenge the populace, the enclosed poster containing the helplines from different organizations will provide learners and DepEd personnel different ways to seek help and persons to contact in times of mental and psychological distress. These organizations may provide mental health and psychosocial support services, as well as wellness checks. The poster may be shown towards the end of events and programs for as long as the country is suffering from COVID-19 pandemic.
- All numbers, both Mental Health Helplines and COVID-19 Emergency Hotlines, shall be updated every March and October of the year since the issuance of the memorandum.
