

**2026 WESTERN VISAYAS REGIONAL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION (WVRAA)
MEET**

To: Schools Division Superintendents
Presidents of State Colleges and Universities
Heads of Private Schools, Colleges and Universities
All Others Concerned

1. The Department of Education Region VI will hold the 2026 Western Visayas Regional Athletic Association (WVRAA) Meet with the theme, **“Stronger Champions, Greater Heights!”** to be hosted by Schools Division of Passi City and the Local Government Unit (LGU) of Passi City on **March 17-23, 2026** at **Passi City Sports Complex, Passi City, Iloilo**.
2. The activity aims to strengthen sports activities in the region and to choose the best learner-athletes to represent Region VI in the 2026 *Palarong Pambansa* in the Province of Agusan Del Sur.
3. There will be eight (8) competing delegations namely: Aklan, Antique, Capiz, Guimaras, Iloilo, Iloilo City, Passi City, and Roxas City.
4. There are 16 events to be played in the Elementary Level to include Futsal Elementary Girls, 25 events in the Secondary Level to include Football Secondary Girls and Weightlifting Secondary Boys and Girls as regular sports events, and four (4) Paragames events to be played by learners with disabilities (LWDs).
5. For the measurable sports such as Athletics, Swimming, and Archery, the Top 2 Best Athletes based on Qualification Standards (QS) shall represent Region VI in the 2026 *Palarong Pambansa*. Should there be no qualifiers in a certain event, the gold medalist shall automatically be the region's representative.
6. The "Modified Winner Take-All Policy" in the seven (7) team sports (basketball, volleyball, football, futsal, sepak takraw, baseball, and softball) shall be observed in all levels of sports competitions.
7. The Regional Office shall be responsible for organizing a team of assessors for each sports discipline during the Regional Meet. The list of Regional Management Team, Non- Officiating and Officiating Officials are



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found in Enclosures 1 and 2 respectively, to this Memorandum. The composition of the Weightlifting Technical Officials shall be announced in a separate Regional Memorandum after the conduct of a regional accreditation for weightlifting.

8. The Non-Officiating and Officiating Officials are required to attend the meeting with the Regional Management Committee on **March 15, 2026** at **1:30 p.m.** at **Passi I Central School** for a general orientation of the conduct of the 2026 WVRAA Meet.

9. All Division Sports Officers with their respective qualified Coaches, Assistant Coaches and Chaperons in the various sports events together with the Regional Management Committee, select Non-Officiating Officials and all the Officiating Officials are required to attend the Solidarity Meeting and Refresher Course on **March 16, 2026, 1:30 p.m.** at the **Passi City Arena**. They shall wear their respective event uniform during the activity.

10. All delegations including the technical officials shall prepare a **three-minute 'Saludo'** to be performed during the entrance and presentation of each participating delegation during the Opening Parade and Program on **March 17, 2026 at 3:00 p.m.** Special awards shall be given to delegations that exhibited commendable performance during the opening program. The mechanics and criteria for the Special Awards are found in Enclosure 7 to this Memorandum.

11. The participants shall be in their delegation uniform during the opening program while the Technical Officials and the Regional TWG members shall wear the complete uniform that will be provided by the LGU of Passi City to be paired preferably with white shoes/sneakers.

13. The Regional Management Committee and the non-officiating officials are expected to arrive at the billeting quarters on **March 11, 2026** with **lunch** as their first meal. On the other hand, the officiating officials are expected to arrive at the billeting quarter on **March 14, 2026** with **lunch** as the first meal while the last meal of all the participants is **breakfast** on **March 23, 2026**. The indicative timeline of the 2026 WVRAA Meet activities is found in Enclosure 3 to this Memorandum.

14. The Regional Screening and Accreditation Committee (RSAC) shall start the acceptance and initial evaluation of the eligibility documents of athletes, coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperones of the 8 delegations on **February 16, 2026** at the DepEd RO VI RELC Dormitory. Their meals and accommodation during the evaluation of the documents including the travel expenses during the final ocular inspection of the 8 delegations shall be charged against the Program Support Fund (PSF) to be downloaded by the *Palarong Pambansa* Board while their food and lodging during the final ocular inspection shall be charged against the local funds/MOOE of the concerned Division. The indicative timeline of activities of the RSAC is found in Enclosure 4 of this Memorandum.

15. To promote environmental sustainability and responsible stewardship and to ensure the health and safety of the learners and personnel, the **ECo Champions Program** shall be integrated into the conduct of the 2026 WVRAA Meet. The mechanics and criteria for the selection of ECo Champions and the health and safety checklist are found in Enclosures 8 and 9, respectively. These will be utilized by the Regional Inspectorate and Validation Team during their ocular visits to the delegations.

16. The following are the enclosures to this Memorandum that stipulate important reminders and guidelines in the conduct of the regional meet for reference and perusal of all concerned:

17. All Schools Division Office shall ensure that the classes of teaching personnel involved in the conduct of this sports activity are not disrupted through the employment of the appropriate learning delivery modality in compliance with the DepEd Order No. 9, s. 2015, titled, *Instituting Measures to Increase Engaged Time-on-Task and Ensuring Compliance Therewith* and DepEd Order No. 3, s. 2024, titled, *Amendment to DepEd Order No. 022, s. 2023*. There shall be no declaration of suspension of classes due to the conduct of this regional activity.

18. The teaching personnel involved in the activity are entitled to Service Credits for their services rendered during weekends and holidays but not to exceed 15 days in accordance with DepEd Order No. 53, s. 2003 entitled: *"Updated Guidelines on the Grant of Vacation Service Credits to Teachers"*. On the other hand, non-teaching personnel shall be provided with Compensatory Time Off (CTO) for their services rendered during weekends and holidays as per *Civil Service Commission (CSC) and Department of Budget and Management (DBM) Joint Circular No. 2, s. 2004 on Non-Monetary Remuneration for Overtime Service Rendered*.

19. The processing of the grant service credits and CTO to teaching and non-teaching personnel, respectively, shall be processed at the Regional Office through the Regional Secretariat considering that the WVRAA Meet is a regional activity pursuant to DO No. 13, s. 2024 titled Revised Guidelines on the Grant of Vacation Service Credits for Teachers,

20. The food, accommodation, and transportation from the billeting quarters to the playing venues of the DepEd officials, coaches, chaperons, and technical officials shall be provided by the LGU of Passi City while the travel expenses, per diems, and other incidental expenses of the participants shall be charged against their respective local funds subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

**GENERAL GUIDELINES AND IMPLEMENTING RULES FOR THE 2026
WVRAA**

PART 1. GENERAL RULES AND GUIDELINES

1. INTERNATIONAL RULES AND GROUND RULES

- 1.1. The International Rules and Regulations of the different sports events shall govern the conduct of all school sports events including the Regional Palaro, however, international rules amended by the "Ground Rules" shall be adapted to suit local conditions. Ground rules supersede international rules.
- 1.2. Ground rules shall be agreed upon by the coaches and tournament managers during the Solidarity Meeting. The coaches and tournament managers concerned must affix their signature on the aforesaid documents and shall submit the same to the General Referee/Athletic Manager for approval. A copy of the signed document shall also be submitted to the Regional Secretariat for filing purposes and future reference.
- 1.3. Coach/es who failed or who refuse to affix their signature on the Ground Rules for any reason is barred from questioning the rules as such rules would still be binding onto them. Unless majority of the coaches have not affixed their signature, in such instance, the Ground Rules would be subjected for the approval of the General Referee/Athletic Manager.
- 1.4. Alteration, amendment or deviation from the approved Ground Rules shall produce no legal effect. Games played via altered, amended, deviated rules would be forfeited. Person/s who had caused/consented/authorized to such alteration, amendment or deviation would be sanctioned.

2. OTHER TECHNICAL RULES

- 2.1. Official balls and equipment to be used during the school sports meet shall be those specified under the international rules/ground rules and shall be provided by the host division.



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2.2. Awarding of medals in some sports event like swimming, boxing, taekwondo, arnis, and gymnastics maybe conducted in their respective venue, provided such was earlier been communicated to the Program and Awards Committee. However, the team trophy shall be awarded during the closing ceremony with the winning athletes, coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperones in complete uniform. The Tournament Directors are directed to have close coordination with the Program and Awards Committee and the Secretariat in cases of awarding of medals before the closing ceremony.

2.3. Tournament managers shall report the progress of their respective games regularly to the Regional Management Committee or whoever is assigned to monitor the games.

2.4. Non-DepED personnel who will be serving as officiating officials shall accomplish and submit an Affidavit of Undertaking duly notarized.

2.5. Only DepED personnel are allowed to serve as Tournament Directors.

2.6. Only the coach, asst. coach, chaperone and the exact official number of the team shall be allowed to sit on the bench during a game. Trainers, supporters, parents, school officials and other non-officiating DepED personnel shall be at the designated place in the bleachers and shall not be allowed to stay in the designated play area. The coach, asst. coach and chaperone shall be in their delegation uniform during the game with proper ID's for identification.

2.7. Communications or gestures suggesting communication/instructions, or actions tending to disrupt or annoy, coming from anyone seated at the bench addressed to the athlete(s) / team / officiating officials is highly discouraged and appropriate sanctions be issued. Specific ground rules shall be promulgated by each event related to this matter to ensure order and safety in the playing venue.

3. OFFICIATING OFFICIALS

3.1. DepEd personnel shall be given priority to officiate in school sports meet; however, non-DepEd personnel may be tapped whenever necessary and they shall be subjected to all policies, rules and regulations set by the Department.



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4. NO COACH, NO PLAY POLICY

- 4.1. The "NO COACH, NO PLAY POLICY" shall be applied to all school sports activities starting from the lower meets to the regional meet.
- 4.2. In cases wherein the non-appearance of the coach is justifiable, the coach concern shall immediately inform his/her respective Division Sports Officer the reason of his/her non-appearance during the particular game. Likewise, the Tournament Director of the event should notify the Regional and the Division Sports Officers so that immediate replacement of the coach shall be done so as not to jeopardize the game of the athletes of the particular event.
- 4.3. Request for replacement of coach shall be done through writing and signed by the concerned personnel, duly noted by the Division Sports Officer and approved by the tournament officials, a day before or within two (2) hours before the start of the particular game subject to the eligibility requirements of athletes, coaches, and chaperones as prescribed by DO No. 43, s. 2016 and other subsequent or related issuances.
- 4.4. The request for replacement of coach shall only be applied to those teams with one (1) coach only.
- 4.5. The team as mentioned in item 4.3 cannot anymore ask for replacement in cases both coaches did not appear in the particular game.

5. DEFAULTING TIME AND FORFEITURE

- 5.1. Defaulting time is fifteen (15) minutes based on the Philippine Standard Time (PST).

6. CODE OF CONDUCT

- 6.1. The code of conduct and proper decorum for government officials and personnel shall remain applicable to officials and coaches participating in any school sports meet including those coming from the private sector. Officials and coaches who failed to observe the code shall be dealt with accordingly.
- 6.2. All unsportsmanlike conduct of coaches/chaperons/trainers/athletes and their supporters, who are DepEd personnel, are grounds for



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suspension/administrative actions, in addition to the sanctions and penalties found in the ground rules of the respective events where the unsportsmanlike conduct was exhibited, which can be applied simultaneously.

6.3. Furthermore, supporters of the athlete/team concerned who are unruly displaying unsportsmanlike conduct during the games of that particular athlete/team shall be sent out of the playing area upon the discretion of the concerned Tournament Director with complete incident report thereafter to be submitted to the Regional Management Team, copy furnished the regional secretariat.

6.4. All incidents of infractions and violations of the code of conduct committed during any school sports meet shall be handled, investigated and decided by the appropriate Committee on Discipline and Decorum (CDD) or whoever is assigned by the Regional Management Team.

6.5. The sanctions found in the ground rules of each respective event can be adopted and imposed by the CDD. Decisions and sanctions imposed by the appropriate CDD shall be executory, without prejudice to an appeal to the respective Schools Division Superintendent/Regional Director which shall be final. No motion for reconsideration shall be entertained and will outright be dismissed.

7. PROTEST ON TECHNICALITIES

The protest on technicalities arising from the games including unsportsmanlike conduct of athletes/coaches/chaperones/trainers and supporters shall be resolved in the following manners:

7.1. The Tournament Director concerned is empowered to conduct an on-the-spot investigation and decide immediately on any protest including unsportsmanlike conduct so as not to disrupt the progress of the games.

7.2. The Tournament Secretary concerned shall record and kept in file the decisions of the Tournament Director and duly signed and verified by them.

7.3. If the parties are not satisfied with the decision of the Tournament Director, a formal written protest, duly signed by the coach concerned and



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noted by the head of the delegation, shall be filed with the Jury of Appeals not later than twelve (12) hours after the incident.

7.4. No protest elevated to the Jury of Appeals shall be entertained if not compliant with item 7.3 and will outright be dismissed.

7.5. The Jury of Appeals shall convene within twenty-four (24) hours upon receipt of the protest and decide the protest.

7.6. The decision of the Jury of Appeals is final and non-appealable. No Motion for Reconsideration would be entertained.

8. PROTEST ON ELIGIBILITY

The eligibility requirements of athletes, coaches, asst. coaches, and chaperones shall be guided by RA 10588, D.O. No. 43, s. 2016 and its subsequent issuances including its rules and procedures on eligibility protest, to wit;

8.1. Protest shall be in writing and duly signed by the coach and noted by the Head of the Delegation and shall be filed before the start of the second game of the concerned team/athlete with the appropriate Screening and Accreditation Committee.

8.2. Protest filed by another person shall be automatically dismissed without prejudice of refilling the same upon compliance of the above-mentioned requirements.

8.3. The DSAC/RSAC may *motu proprio* conduct investigation if there is an obvious truth or merit of the allegations questioning the eligibility of the athletes/coaches.

8.4. Protest shall be accompanied by affidavit of witnesses and/or evidence to support thereof.

8.5. The protest shall be acted upon immediately by the DSAC/RSAC within twenty four (24) hours upon receipt thereof.

8.6. The protestant shall have the burden of proof and shall provide necessary evidence (documentary/testimonials) otherwise the protest will be dismissed.



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8.7. The DSAC/RSAC may also conduct investigation on complaint/s of misrepresentation, impersonation and violations of similar nature, for purposes of determining the eligibility of the athlete without prejudice to the filing of administrative and criminal actions against the person/s responsible thereto.

8.8. The DSAC/RSAC shall act on information of violation of eligibility of athletes/coaches and take necessary actions even after the Regional Palaro. It shall determine the existence of a *prima facie* case.

8.9. Decision of the DSAC/RSAC shall be FINAL. No motion for reconsideration shall be entertained and will be dismissed outright.

8.10. Appeal from the decision of the RSAC can be taken to the NSAC. No Appeal on eligibility protest shall be taken after the end of the WVRAA Meet.

PART 2. SANCTIONS

9. VIOLATION OF CODE OF CONDUCT INCLUDING UNSPORTSMANLIKE CONDUCT

9.1. Personnel of the Department of Education, personnel of partner private schools, and personnel of partner LGU serving in whatever capacity during the duration of the school sports event shall be sanctioned according to these guidelines and the agreed ground rules.

9.2. Aside from the sanctioned imposed under number 9.1, they may be suspended from participating in future school sports competition in whatever capacity, the duration of which shall be one (1) to three (3) years depending on the gravity of the offense. Provided that he/she shall suffer the penalty of perpetual disqualification from participating in any future school sports competition in whatever capacity in case of violations which are intentional and willful.

9.3. These sanctions shall be without prejudice to the filing of appropriate administrative, civil and/or criminal charges against the erring officials and personnel in accordance with existing laws, rules and regulations.

9.4. Further, immediate sanctions under their respective events ground rules/international rules shall be applied.



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9.5. DepEd personnel not serving in any capacity during the school sports event but nonetheless participated as supporters/official delegation members, in case of violations, shall likewise be sanctioned.

9.6. The report or complaint of violation of code of conduct including unsportsmanlike conduct must be written, signed by the complainant, and duly noted by the head of the delegation and shall be filed within twelve (12) hours after the incident. The investigation by the Committee on Discipline and Decorum (CDD) will be under the authority of the appropriate SDS/Regional Director.

9.7. For those incidents that are not covered by the ground rules or otherwise inapplicable, the Tournament Director shall write an incident report or narrative report together with their actions taken or sanctions imposed and to be submitted to the Jury of Appeals.

10. VIOLATION OF THE ELIGIBILITY RULES

10.1. In team competitions, the games where the ineligible and/or disqualified athlete has taken part shall be declared forfeited in favor of the opposing team.

10.2. In individual competitions, the games where the ineligible and/or disqualified athlete played shall be forfeited in favor of the other athlete.

10.3. The individuals who caused the violation of the rules on eligibility may be suspended from participating in future school sports competitions in whatever capacity, the duration of which shall be one (1) to three (3) years depending on the gravity of the offense. Provided that he/she shall suffer the penalty of perpetual disqualification from participating in any future school sports competition in whatever capacity in case of violations which are intentional and willful.

10.4. The respective appropriate Screening and Accreditation Committee shall determine the violations on eligibility and its gravity for the imposition of appropriate sanctions subject to the approval of Schools Division Superintendent/Regional Director.



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10.5. These sanctions shall be without prejudice to the filing of appropriate administrative and/or criminal charges against the erring officials and/or athletes in accordance with existing laws, rules and regulations.

**PART 3. AWARDING, SELECTION AND COMPOSITION OF ATHLETES
AND COACHES AWARDING OF MEDALS, TROPHIES AND
CERTIFICATES OF RECOGNITION AND PARTICIPATION**

11. The Tournament Directors of the different sports events may conduct their respective awarding ceremonies at their respective venues. The first to fifth (1st to 5th) placers in the overall ranking in the elementary and secondary divisions may be awarded trophies during the closing ceremonies, subject to the approval of the Program and Awards Committee and the host SDO. Likewise, trophies may also be awarded to the most bemedalled athletes in the following events: **(1)** Athletics - Elementary and Secondary (Boys and Girls) **(2)** Swimming - Elementary and Secondary (Boys and Girls) **(3)** Gymnastics - Elementary and Secondary (Boys and Girls) **(4)** Archery - Secondary Boys and Girls, again subject to the approval of the Program and Awards Committee and the host SDO.
12. Special performance of athletes in the different sports events shall be given due recognition through the Certificate of Recognition, if necessary and approved by the Program and Awards Committee. These awards will be given during the awards ceremony of every sports event in their respective venues.
13. Certificate of Participation and/or Recognition will be given to the coaches, chaperons, trainers, officiating officials, working committee and the management through the Regional Secretariat Committee.

14. ATHLETES QUALIFIED FOR THE NEXT LEVEL OF SCHOOL SPORTS MEET

- 14.1. The selection of athletes in the next level of competitions shall be based on the individual performance of the athletes through qualifying standards for measurable sports and winner take all policy for team sports specified in DM No. 5, s. 2023 specifically baseball, basketball, football, futsal, speak takraw, softball and volleyball. The policy of "winner take all" shall commence from the school meet to the next higher-level sports meet and shall include NOT ONLY THE LEARNER ATHLETES but also the team coaches, assistant coaches and chaperones involved and who participated



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in the school meet to qualify to the next level of school sports meet. Non-observance thereof of the above policy shall merit appropriate sanctions and possible administrative penalties for personnel who willingly disregarded the policy.

14.2. In instances of waiver under justifiable circumstance or under unforeseen event limiting the participation of qualified athletes for the next level of school sports meet, the selection of athletes to compose the WVRAA delegation to the Palarong Pambansa, the Regional Office will designate a five-man team to compose the Selection Committee for the sports event, namely;

a. Regional Sports Officer	- as the Chairperson
b. Winning Coach	- Member
c. Tournament Director	- Member
d. Asst. Tournament Director	- Member
e. RSAC Chairperson	- Member

**MEASURABLE STANDARDS OF THE 8TH PLACE IN THE PREVIOUS PALARONG PAMBANSA WILL BE IMPLEMENTED IN ORDER TO QUALIFY*

14.3. The list of qualified athletes/athletes' gallery/eligibility documents should be submitted to the Regional ESSD Chief/RSO/RSAC Chairman immediately after the finals of each respective event duly signed by the person/s concerned and the Tournament Director. A meeting with the winning coaches and the Selection Committee will be set to finalize the official delegation for the Palarong Pambansa. This will be done during the Post-2026 WVRAA Meet Conference or in any possible engagement for this purpose.

14.4. The Regional Palaro Management has the right to replace selected players who will not be able to join/play in the Palarong Pambansa for whatever reasons that prevented them from joining subject to existing eligibility requirements and subsequent and related issuances.

14.5. The management shall have the authority to appoint a replacement in case of unavailability of winning coaches and other team members for the Palarong Pambansa subject to eligibility requirements.

14.6. In case the selected players and coaches will not be able to join the Palarong Pambansa, a written letter stating the reasons should be



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submitted to the Regional Director. The letter should be signed by the athlete/s and their parents, the coach, the Division Sports Officer and duly noted by the Schools Division Superintendent concerned.

15. COMPOSITION OF ATHLETES

15.1. For Team Sports. Winner takes all policy shall be adapted for baseball, basketball, football, futsal, sepak takraw, softball and volleyball.

In cases wherein the Selection Committee be allowed for reasonable and justifiable circumstance to fill up of slots for higher level meet, the decision of the Selection Committee shall prevail subject to eligibility requirements.

15.2. For Racket Games (Badminton, Table Tennis, Tennis). The top four (4) players shall represent that particular team.

Further replacement in the team composition shall be determined by the Palaro Management through the Selection Committee subject to eligibility requirements.

15.3. For Individual Games.

- **Chess:** The individual standing of the athletes (top two players) will be the basis for the selection.
- **Billiards:** The individual standing of the athletes (top two players) will be the basis for the selection.
- **Gymnastics:** Individual All Around Standing
- **Taekwondo:** Individual result
- **Individual Category Champion**
- **Arnis:** Individual standing in the different weight categories (secondary) and top champion team (elementary)

Further replacement in the team composition shall be determined by the Regional Palaro Management through the Selection Committee subject to eligibility requirements.

16. SELECTION OF COACHES

16.1. Team Sports - Coach of the champion team

16.2. Racket Games - The coach of the top player (rank 1)

16.3. Individual Events

- Gymnastics: Champion IAA
- Arnis: Overall Champion
- Billiards: Top Individual Player
- Boxing: Overall Champion



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- Athletics : Overall Champion
- Swimming : Highest number of points garnered by the team
- Archery: Overall Champion
- Chess: Top Individual Player
- Taekwondo : Overall Champion

16.4. In cases that the overall champion coach does not have player in the team, the coach concerned will be replaced by the 2nd rank coach with a player. If in case the 2nd rank coach still do not have player in the team, the Palaro Management shall appoint a replacement through the Selection Committee subject to eligibility requirements.

17. SELECTION OF ASSISTANT COACHES AND CHAPERONES

17.1. Assistant coaches of the champion coaches as well as their chaperones shall automatically be selected as assistant coaches and chaperones, respectively, for the next level sports event subject to eligibility requirements.

18. FAILURE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE NEXT LEVEL SPORTS ACTIVITY

18.1. Athletes, coaches, assistant coaches or chaperones who failed or declined to participate in the next level school sports activities despite being selected and qualified shall execute a waiver in writing signed by them and addressed to the Regional Director.

18.2. Athletes need their parent's signature to execute the waiver and need to be noted by the SDS, as well as the coaches' waiver to participate.

18.3. Coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperones who executed a waiver shall be ineligible to participate in succeeding school sports activities in whatever capacity during the school year and the next school year.

19. REPORT ON THE CONDUCT OF SCHOOL ATHLETIC MEET

19.1. The Tournament Directors shall prepare a narrative report on the conduct of their respective sport events. Likewise, the Monitoring and Evaluation Committee shall prepare the overall regional report on the proceedings of the sports meet for submission to the appropriate agency head.



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PART 4. TECHNICAL COMMITTEES AND OFFICIALS

20. The Regional Screening & Accreditation Committee (RSAC)

20.1. The composition the Regional Screening and Accreditation Committee (RSAC) shall consist of a Chairman, coming from the DepEd Legal Division or whoever is designated by the Regional Director, one (1) physician, one (1) Dentist, one (1) representative from each school division and (1) one documenter to be designated by the Regional Director. Alternate will be allowed when the regular member is not available.

20.2. Qualification of Schools Division Representative. The schools division representative shall be the Chairman or a member of the Schools Division Screening Committee (DSAC) during the Meet preceding the current WVRAA Meet.

20.3. Duties and Functions of the RSAC

- a. Evaluate/verify the authenticity of the athletes'/coaches'/chaperons' documents before and during personal interview.
- b. Accredit qualified athletes, coaches and chaperons to the WVRAA Meet.
- c. Issue list of qualified athletes, coaches, and chaperons, and Palaro Identification Cards (IDs) before the opening of WVRAA Meet.
- d. Consider replacement for disqualified athletes during the period of screening.
- e. Formulate ground rules not covered by the guidelines on eligibility.
- f. Issues athletes' photo galleries to Tournament Managers.
- g. Re-check and monitor with the Tournament Managers the fielding of athletes during the actual Competition based on the photo gallery.
- h. Investigate and render decisions on cases of protests/complaints on eligibility and inform the Tournament Manager on the decision(s) made. All decisions shall be approved by the majority of the members of the RSAC.
- i. Submit all updated records of athletes to the School Sports Events and Activities Unit (SSEAU) for centralized filing and safekeeping.

21. Tournament Directors and Assistant Tournament Directors

21.1. Duties and Responsibilities

- a. Be at the game venue at least 45 minutes before the start of the game.
- b. Prepare and submit schedules/diagram and assignment of officiating officials.



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- c. Examine all equipment to be use according to specifications prescribed by international rules or the ground rules.
- d. Check all the playing fields according to the international rules of the game and provisions on safety.
- e. Submit to the appropriate school sports events Head written ground rules approved and signed by all participating coaches, after the solidarity meeting.
- f. Serve as Chairperson of the TECHNICAL COMMITTEE, composed of officiating officials in their respective sports events, Head/Officer-in-charge to deliberate and decide immediately on protest regarding technicalities. Only protests which cannot be resolved by the committee or although resolved has a motion for reconsideration/appeal will be elevated to the Jury of Appeal.
- g. Submit post-tournament report indicating the daily attendance and performance rating of officiating officials which will be furnished to their respective Schools Division Superintendents.
- h. Affix his/her initials in the C.S. form 48 of all officiating officials in the sports event concerned after the duration of the WVRAA meet/school sports event.
- i. Make provision for crowd control during the tournament in coordination with Committee on Security or the concerned LGU.
- j. Scout and submit names of outstanding performers in the event including their division/school except athletics, swimming and combative sports.
- k. Conduct a daily brief evaluation conference with all officiating officials on actual performance after the last scheduled game of the day.

22. Tournament Secretaries

22.1. Duties and Responsibilities

- a. Prepare and submit the needed form for the presentation of athletes, coaches, scorers, officiating officials, etc. during the initial/championship games to the announcers.
- b. Take charge of the preparation and submission of the necessary forms (game results, score sheets, timer's report, judge at finish report, etc. for immediate submission to the Secretariat Committee.
- c. Record all deliberations on protests and meetings held.
- d. Check all attendance of all officiating officials daily.
- e. Keep all records of game results for ready reference.
- f. Assist the tournament directors in the performance of their duties.



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23. Regional Secretariat

23.1. Duties and Responsibilities

- a. Record and prepare minutes of the meetings.
- b. Accept protests in the various sports events and facilitate the scheduling of mediation with the Jury of Appeals
- c. Prepare and print IDs of athletes, coaches, TOs, TWG members, and other officials prior to the conduct of the game.
- d. Prepare official list, contact numbers of athletes, coaches, Tos, and TWG members.
- e. Prepare Certificates of Recognition for guests, TOs, TWG members, coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperones.
- f. Prepare plaques and tokens of appreciation for the host school, region, and Schools Division.
- g. Prepare daily attendance of the athletes, coaches, and other officials.
- h. Distribute DTR for the compensatory time-off of the TOs and TWG members.
- i. Prepare forms for sports events.
- j. File / distribute signed ground rules and schedule of games to the committees concerned.
- k. Prepare / sign clearance of TDs with the Regional Management Committee.
- l. Facilitate the grant of service credits and CTO to teaching and non-teaching personnel

24. Jury of Appeals

24.1. Duties and Responsibilities

- a. Resolve protest related to technical matters affecting the conduct of the game as early as possible.
- b. Composition of the Jury of Appeals
 - 1) Chairperson – ARD or his/her authorized representative
 - 2) Vice-Chairpersons – ASDS of the host division
- Legal Officer of Host Division
 - 3) Members:
 - a. One (1) member per athletic delegation preferably ASDS or any duly designated personnel by the SDS, provided that he/she is a permanent/regular DepED employee.
 - b. Regional Sports Officer



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- c. A Secretary will be designated by the host division, who will safe keep all documents and records of all proceedings but has no power to vote on matters brought to the Jury.
- d. Majority of the Jury of Appeals present on a meeting is sufficient to transact and decide questions and protest on technicalities including the handing of sanctions for any violations as stated in these guidelines. Decision of the Jury of Appeals is **final** and no motion for reconsideration or appeal shall be entertained.

25. Committee on Discipline and Decorum (CDD)

25.1. All violations of the Code of Conduct during the school sports activities committed by DepEd or non-DepEd personnel shall be in writing signed by the complainant and filed within twenty four (24) hours upon the incident with the Committee on Discipline and Decorum (CDD).

25.2. Composition of the CDD:

- a) Assistant Regional Director - Chairperson
- b) Regional Sports Officer - Vice-Chairperson
- c) Members:
 - Regional CAO
 - SDS or his/her authorized representative from where the person complaint of belongs
 - Representative from private School Organization
 - Legal Officer
 - A secretariat (coming from the host SDO)

26. Officiating Officials

26.1. Duties and Responsibilities

- a. Report daily to assigned events even not scheduled to officiate in order to gain inputs in officiating. This strategy will also ensure the availability of officiating officials up to the last day of the sports meet.
- b. Update knowledge of the rules of the game.
- c. Run/manage the competition with fairness, integrity and dedication to duty.
- d. Attend daily evaluation conference on actual officiating after the last game schedule of the day.



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Part 5. SELECTION OF TOURNAMENT DIRECTORS and OFFICIATING OFFICIALS AND EVALUATION OF PERFORMANCE

27. The selection of all tournament directors, assistant tournament directors and officiating officials in WVRAA Meet will be done by the Regional Committee composed of the Regional Director, the Regional Sports Officer, and the Division Sports Officers.
28. The following are the criteria for selection of TOs:
 1. Must have officiated in lower meets like Provincial/City Meets – with corresponding certification.
 2. Updated knowledge and mastery of the rules of the game as shown in actual officiating.
 3. Has attended the accreditation with corresponding certificate.
 4. Have shown the highest ethical conduct in the game (honesty, integrity, fairness, etc.).
 5. Have strong dedication to duty.
 6. Perfect attendance during the WVRAA meet including daily evaluation conference.
 7. Have no derogatory records.
 8. Physically, medically and mentally fit supported by a Medical Certificate from a government physician.
29. Unethical/immoral conduct that may be committed by delegation officials, coaches and chaperons/trainers shall be given disciplinary action by the head of the delegation.
30. The evaluation of performance of the TDs and ATDs shall be done by the Regional Management Team while the performance of the other Tournament Officials shall be done by their respective TDs.
31. Officiating Officials with Unsatisfactory rating will no longer be accepted to officiate in the succeeding WVRAA Meet.

**GUIDELINES IN THE SEARCH FOR ECO CHAMPIONS IN THE 2026
WESTERN VISAYAS REGIONAL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION (WVRAA) MEET**

I. Rationale

In support of the Department of Education's thrust on environmental sustainability, disaster risk reduction and management, and climate-responsive education, the **ECO Champions Program** shall be adopted in the conduct of the 2026 WVRAA Meet to promote environmentally responsible practices and stewardship. The program shall serve as mechanism to operationalize eco-friendly initiatives and promote disaster preparedness activities throughout the duration of the event.

The ECO Champions Program shall be implemented through the three (3) key components, namely: **(1) tree planting activity**, to promote environmental protection and greening of school and community spaces; **(2) solid waste management**, to ensure proper waste segregation, reduction, and cleanliness within the billeting areas and immediate surroundings; and **(3) disaster resilience**, to strengthen disaster preparedness and safety and risk awareness practices in the school community.

The implementation of the ECO Champions Program in the regional meet is expected to minimize environmental and safety risks, strengthen compliance with existing policies, and foster a culture of environmental stewardship and disaster resilience, thereby supporting the safe, orderly, and environmentally sustainable conduct of the 2026 WVRAA Meet.

II. Objectives

The ECO Champions Program in the 2026 WVRAA Meet aims to:

1. promote environmental stewardship among learners, teachers, coaches, officials, and support personnel through the tree planting activities proper waste management practices in the billeting schools and immediate surroundings;
2. strengthen disaster resilience in school through the conduct of disaster preparedness activities; and
3. foster a culture of accountability, discipline, and responsibility toward environmental protection, safety, and climate-responsive practices among learners and DepEd personnel.



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III. Mechanics and Criteria

The ECo Champions Program in the 2026 WVRAA Meet shall shall be implemented through the following:

3.1. Participants: All the eight (8) delegations of the 2026 WVRAA Meet.

3.2. Areas: The major areas in the assigned billeting schools including the facilities within the school premises used for accommodation, dining, and other athlete-related activities, such as:

1. Sleeping quarters
2. Kitchen
3. Dining Hall
4. Storage Room
5. Comfort Room/Shower Room
6. Waste Disposal Area / Material Recovery Facility (MRF)
7. Drainage System
8. Vector and pest control
9. Over-all surroundings

3.3. Billeting School Inspection. Billeting areas shall be inspected at random. No particular schedule of the visit shall be observed.

1. Monitoring and evaluation of the cleanliness of the billeting school, solid waste management practices, and safety preparedness measures shall be conducted as well as verification of the number of trees planted.

2. Inspection will start the day after the opening ceremony and continue in the succeeding days before the closing ceremonies to give time for the committee to consolidate and deliberate the results.

3. Inspection by the Regional Inspectorate and Validation Team shall be done only once. No re-visits shall be conducted.

4. The designated ECo Champions Program (ECP) Coordinator of each delegation is requested to accompany the evaluation team during the inspection of the facilities together with the school head.

3.4. Activities: The three (3) components of the Eco Champions Program shall be implemented:

1. **Greening Project** – conduct of tree planting and nurturing activities as well as documentation and tagging of the planting sites within the school premises or adopted areas. The delegation shall plant native trees within the school premises. In the event that the school does not have enough space for



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planting trees, the ECP Coordinator in coordination with the school head shall coordinate with the Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Office (MENRO) for the identification of a planting site in the community.

2. **Solid Waste Management** – practice of waste segregation, reduction, cleanliness, and proper disposal in the billeting school.

3. **Disaster Resilience** – implementation of safety protocols, preparedness measures, and emergency response initiatives within school facilities.

3.5. Categories and Criteria: The Search for ECo Champions in the 2026 WVRAA Meet recognizes outstanding performance of the delegations in the following categories:

1. **Most Organized Delegation** – For the school delegation that efficiently manages the various facilities of the school and resources during the event.

**DEPED WESTERN VISAYAS BASKETBALL LEAGUE
TOURNAMENT GUIDELINES**

I. PURPOSE.

The **DepEd Western Visayas Basketball League** is designed as a meaningful platform for teachers and education leaders to embody and promote positive values through the game of basketball. More than just a sporting event, the league provides an avenue to cultivate teamwork, leadership, discipline, and integrity—virtues that are essential both on the court and in the education profession. By fostering camaraderie, goodwill, and sportsmanship among educators, the league reflects how the spirit of the game can strengthen collaboration, inspire excellence, and reinforce the shared commitment to molding learners and building stronger communities across Western Visayas.

II. ELIGIBILITY

1. Players must be DepEd Hired (Teacher, AO, ADA, ADAS, PDO, Engineer, Doctor, Nurses, COS, etc.)
2. DepEd hired players should hold a permanent position or COS (Contract of Service) for at least 6 months.
3. Each team shall submit the following documents of their players:
 - a. Photocopy of Appointment or Contract; and
 - b. Any valid Id.
4. Any Honorary Member of the Sports Council of the respective Schools Division Office (Governor, Vice Governor, Congressman, Board Member, City Mayor, City Vice Mayor, City Councilor).
5. Any violation of the abovementioned eligibility shall subject the team to disqualification.

III. TEAM COMPOSITION

1. This league shall be composed of the following teams:
 - a. Schools Division of Aklan
 - b. Schools Division of Antique
 - c. Schools Division of Capiz
 - d. Schools Division of Guimaras
 - e. Schools Division of Iloilo
 - f. Schools Division of Iloilo City
 - g. Schools Division of Passi City
 - h. Schools Division Roxas City
 - i. DepEd Regional Office VI



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2. Participating teams must have at least 15 players composed of at least one (1) 50-year-old player and two (2) Forty-year-old player.
3. Each team must have at least one (1) coach.
4. A player can act as a playing coach.
5. Due to the limited number of pool of players, the Regional Office Team can have the option to select its players from any Schools Division Office. For emphasis, this rule is exclusive only to the Regional Office Team.

IV. UNIFORM

1. All players must wear prescribed basketball attire.
2. Each team should select a team color as agreed.

V. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Coaches of the playing team should know the rules and regulation of the game and must see to it that they are in total control of their players and their benches.
2. Only the coaches of the playing team are allowed to stand and make necessary verification/ complaints during the progress of the game.

VI. TEAM DISCIPLINE AND CONDUCT OF PLAYERS

1. A team must be present at the playing court fifteen (15) minutes before the scheduled match. In case a team will not show up after a grace period of fifteen (15) minutes, the TEAM will LOSE the game by forfeiture.
2. Players who are under the influence of liquor or any prohibited substance are not allowed to play.
3. Only the coach or the Team Captain in the floor can communicate with the game officials regarding technicalities but not judgement call. However, it should be in a courteous and calm manner.
4. A player shall be disqualified / send out of the game if:
 - a. He commits two (2) technical fouls in a game;
 - b. He commits two (2) unsportsmanlike fouls in a game;
 - c. He commits both or combination of the two type of fouls mentioned.
 - d. The technical committee has the power to disqualify any player that may cause detrimental values to the league.
5. A player/coach disqualified or send out of the game shall be automatically suspended on his next game. Repeating this offense shall be automatically disqualified from further participation in the league.



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6. A team who “walked-out” on the game shall lose the game by forfeiture.
7. In case of fights, every player involved will be automatically banned from the league. A fight means: someone who has thrown a punch or kick an opponent or other physical contact that is not related to basketball. The officials and the technical committees still have the final decision.
8. In the absence of the coach, the team captain will act as the playing coach.
9. Player/s caught giving an obscene sign such as dirty finger or heard saying bad words to any official/s, technical committee/s, or to an opponent, that player/s will be given:
 - a. Technical foul on the first offense;
 - b. Thrown out of the game on the second offense and will be suspended on his next team game.
10. All players must bring at least 1 valid ID on/before the opening day for evaluation purposes.
11. The game shall strictly start as per schedule prepared by the committee: Elimination Rounds / Semi -Finals / Championship. Each team shall be given ten (10) minutes for warm up before the scheduled start of the game.

VII. TOURNAMENT GROUND RULES

1. TOURNAMENT FORMAT. The tournament shall adopt the FIBA Official Basketball Rules as of October 1st 2024.
2. ELIMINATION GAMES. The teams will be grouped in two brackets. Each bracket will play in a round robin format to determine the Top 2 teams. The Team Brackets are as follows:

SDO Guimaras
SDO Aklan
SDO Antique

BRACKET B

SDO Roxas City
SDO Capiz
SDO Iloilo
SDO Iloilo City
SDO Passi City

3. CROSSOVER PLAYOFFS. The Top 1 and Top 2 Teams of each bracket will qualify for the Semifinals and play for a crossover where the Top 1 Team of Bracket A will play against the Top 2 Team of Bracket B and vice versa in a DO or DIE format.
4. SEMIFINALS: The winners in the Semifinals will qualify for the Championship. The losers will play for the Battle for Third.
5. CHAMPIONSHIP. The Championship shall be decided by a DO or DIE Game.



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6. PLAYERS. Each quarter, starting from the First Quarter up to the Fourth Quarter, shall be played with the following team composition composed of at least one (1) 50 year-old-player and at least two (2) Forty-year-old players which we shall call as the **Magic Three**.

- Composition A (Magic Three is composed of one (1) 50-year-old player and two (2) Forty-year-old players):
 1. Player 1 - 50 years old and above
 2. Player 2 - 40 years old and above
 3. Player 3 - 40 years old and above
 4. Player 4 and 5 – 39 years old and below.
- Composition B (Magic Three is composed of two (2) 50-year-old players and one (1) Forty-year-old player):
 1. Player 1 - 50 years old and above
 2. Player 2 - 50 years old and above
 3. Player 3 - 40 years old and above
 4. Player 4 and 5 – 39 years old and below.

7. SUBSTITUTION. Open Substitution will be observed every quarter provided that there shall always be a Magic Three Players in the court at all times (from First Quarter up to the Fourth Quarter).

8. GAME DURATION. 10 Minutes per quarter.

9. OVERTIME. Overtime games shall still follow the five (5) minutes extension after regulation until game is decided.

10. LACKING PLAYERS PER GAME.

- The Game Format observed in this Tournament is made is such a way that there is a Magic Three players at all times which also follows that they are the highlight of this tournament. In the event that there is one player lacking in the Magic Three, an additional of fifteen (15) points shall be added to the opposing team per quarter. This means that an opposing team can have a maximum of additional sixty (60) points for four (4) quarters.
- Should both teams have a lacking player in the Magic Three, each lacking player shall cancel out the lacking player in the other team. The other team with less number of lacking player(s) from the Magic Three shall be entitled for the corresponding number of additional points.

11. TIMEOUT: There shall be 5 Timeouts that shall be given to every team. Timeouts can be utilized as follows:

- 1st Quarter – 1 Timeout
- 2nd Quarter – 1 Timeout
- 3rd Quarter – 1 Timeout
- 4th Quarter – 2 Timeouts

- Timeouts per quarter can only be used on that specific quarter also. Timeouts are not carried over to the next quarter if not
