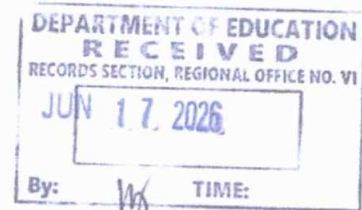

1. In reference to DepEd Memorandum No. OM-OUGOPS-2026-02-01383 dated May 8, 2026, entitled *Implementation of Khan Academy for School Year 2026–2027*, funds are hereby made available for the capacity-building of teachers on the effective integration and utilization of Khan Academy as a supplementary learning resource.
2. The Department of Education (DepEd) shall allocate funds amounting to **Twenty Three Million Three Hundred Fifty-Seven Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (P23,357,500.00.00)** under the FY 2026 Human Resource Development for Personnel in Schools and Learning Centers (HRDPSLC) Funds. The funds shall be downloaded by the National Educators Academy of the Philippines (NEAP) to the Regional Offices (ROs) to cover expenses related to the Khan Academy capability-building activities for School Year 2026–2027, consistent with the Human Resource Development Programs, Activities, and Projects (HRD PAPs).
3. The prescribed allocations under these Guidelines are intended for fund allocation and downloading purposes and shall not be construed as automatic eligibility for entitlement or payment. Actual utilization of funds, including travel expenses, accommodation, venue, and other authorized expenditures, shall be subject to existing budgeting, accounting, auditing, procurement, and travel rules and regulations, including Executive Order No. 77, s. 2019 or the *"Prescribing Rules and Regulations and Rates of Expenses and Allowances for Official Local and Foreign Travels of Government Personnel,"* DepEd Order No. 2,



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s. 2018 or the "Guidelines on the Allocation of Funds for Venue, Meals, Snacks, and Room Accommodation for Official Activities Organized and Conducted by the Department of Education," and other applicable issuances. The details on fund allocation and utilization, training design, implementation arrangements, and reporting requirements are provided in the following annexes:

- Annex A – Budget Allocation
- Annex B – Implementation Procedure
- Annex C – Training Requirements
- Annex D - Khan Regional Focal Persons as of June 10, 2026

4. The concerned ROs are authorized to determine the appropriate mode of fund release, whether by cash advance, reimbursement, or other authorized mechanisms, in accordance with existing rules and regulations.
5. Any excess amount or resulting balance may be utilized for expenses related to the implementation of the program/activity/project (P/A/P) covered by this issuance, subject to existing budgeting, accounting, auditing, and procurement laws, rules, and regulations.
6. In cases where the downloaded funds are insufficient, available local funds including HRDPSLC Fund in the Region and Division may be utilized, subject to existing guidelines and applicable accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
7. Participants who are required to travel from distant schools, divisions, or regions and whose attendance necessitates board and lodging due to the proximity of their residence or official station to the training venue may charge the corresponding expenses against available local funds, including Regional and Schools Division HRDPSLC funds, subject to applicable government rules and regulations.
8. All offices concerned shall ensure proper documentation, monitoring, and timely submission of reports as required.
9. The conduct of these activities shall be in accordance with DepEd Order No. 009, s. 2026 [Guidelines on the Implementation of the Three-Term School Calendar in Basic Education].

## ANNEX A: BUDGET ALLOCATION

In line with the current agreement between DepEd and Khan Academy Philippines and to support the effective implementation of the Khan Academy capacity-building activities for School Year (SY) 2026-2027, the Department of Education (DepEd) Central Office, through NEAP, shall download funds to the Regional Offices (ROs), subject to existing government budgeting, accounting, auditing, and procurement rules and regulations. The Notice of Cash Allocation (NCA) to cover the payment of obligations against the downloaded funds shall be requested from the corresponding Department of Budget and Management Regional Office.

Upon receipt of the Sub-Allotment Release Order (Sub-ARO), the Regional Khan Academy Focal Persons shall coordinate with Regional Budget Officer and Regional Planning Officer for the proper tagging of Sub-ARO in the Program Management Information System (PMIS) account and shall facilitate the downloading of HRDPSLC Fund to the School Division Offices, when applicable and cost-effective. All Sub-AROs shall be created with a Work and Financial Plan and must be properly uploaded in the PMIS to ensure proper monitoring and accountability of funds.

To ensure judicious use of funds, the downloaded fund per training shall be utilized for the following allowable expenses in accordance with the existing budgeting, accounting, auditing, and procurement laws, rules, and regulations.

- a. Six Hundred Pesos (P600.00) per participant for each face-to-face training, to cover the costs of the training venue, meals, and refreshments (AM snack, lunch, and PM snack);
- b. Two Thousand Pesos (P2,000.00) per trainer per night for accommodation during each batch of face-to-face training;
- c. Seven Hundred Pesos (P700.00) per participant for each face-to-face training, to cover local transportation expenses;
- d. One Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (P1,500.00) per implementing school for travel expense for technical assistance and the conduct of monitoring and evaluation activities; and
- e. Travel expenses to cover the domestic travel and local transportation costs of Khan Academy trainers for each batch of face-to-face training.

Participants in the training include Regional and SDO officials and Khan Focal persons, Khan Academy implementing teachers, and Khan Academy Trainers.

## ANNEX B: IMPLEMENTATION PROCEDURE

### Step 1: Budget Verification and SDO Clustering

Upon receipt of the Sub-Allotment Release Order (Sub-ARO), the RO shall verify their total allocation based on Annex A: *Budget Allocation*.

- **Number of Participants:** A maximum of 150 participants shall participate in the training/capacity-building activity per session. The participants shall consist of the teacher-participants, trainers, Regional and SDO Khan focal persons, and support and logistics personnel.
- **Small SDOs:** Divisions with fewer than 150 participants may **combine or cluster** with neighboring SDOs to form a single 150-pax session. This ensures the logistical efficiency of the KAPH training team.
- **Focal Coordination:** Division Khan Academy Focal Persons (DKFPs) of clustered SDOs must designate a "Lead SDO" to handle procurement and logistics for the joint session.

### Step 2: Procurement of Catering and Venue

The RO/SDO (or Lead SDO for clusters) shall manage the procurement of food and secure a suitable venue, subject to *Republic Act No. 12009 or the New Government Procurement Act and its implementing rules and regulations (IRR)*, and the Guidelines in Annex C: *Training Requirements*.

- **Food Provision:** 1 lunch and 2 snacks (AM/PM) per participant.
- **Venue Requirements:** See Annex C: *Training Requirements* for the Venue and other training requirements.

### Step 3: Coordination of Trainer Logistics

ROs must utilize the **Training Costs Budget** to cover the costs of bringing the KAPH training team to the ROs/SDOs:

- **Trainer Eligibility Requirement:** The budget for trainer logistics is restricted to pre-identified Khan Ph trainers.
- **Scope:** Round-trip travel (land/air/sea), meals, and two nights of separate air-conditioned accommodations for trainers.

### Step 4: Liquidation and Reporting

The RO shall ensure timely liquidation according to existing accounting and auditing rules, including perfected purchase orders for logistics and signed payroll for teacher subsidies. Compliance with the Commission on Audit (COA) Circular 2012-1 or Prescribing the Revised Guidelines and Documentary Requirements for Common Government Transactions shall be observed in the liquidation of expenses.

### Step 5: Local Supplemental Funds

Regional and Division Offices are encouraged to support these activities using available local funds or the Special Education Fund (SEF), as applicable, for any requirements exceeding the standard Central Office allocation. The utilization of the SEF shall be subject to the provisions of Joint Circular No. 1, s. 2025 and other existing applicable policies and guidelines.

## ANNEX C: TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

Below are the minimum requirements from each RO to successfully facilitate one teacher training session:

### Venue

- Air-conditioned training venue with a minimum seating capacity for 150 participants.
- With Sanitation Permit and clean and functional restroom/s accessible to participants within or adjacent to the venue premises, with continuous water supply and lighting.
- One (1) table and one (1) chair per participant, plus additional tables and chairs for trainers, secretariat, and registration personnel.
- One (1) podium or speaker's lectern for trainers and one (1) designated registration table measuring at least 1 meter in length.
- Training venue capable of accommodating all participants in a classroom-style seating arrangement.
- Venue equipped with adequate lighting, ventilation, and electrical outlets sufficient for training equipment and participant use.

### Equipment

- Projector or LED screen with HDMI connectivity, visible to all participants
- Functional microphone and speakers
- Stable internet connectivity with a minimum speed of 300 Mbps for 150 participants
- Available back-up internet connection to ensure uninterrupted training sessions
- Adequate power outlets, charging stations, extension cords, and chargers.

### Participant Preparation

- Food and refreshments for participants during the necessary breaks
  - AM snacks
  - Lunch
  - PM snacks
- 1 tablet/ laptop/ desktop per teacher participant

1. In line with the Department of Education's steadfast commitment to strengthen the foundational literacy and numeracy skills of Filipino learners, these Offices reiterate the continued use of Khan Academy as a supplemental digital learning platform in public schools. The platform shall further support the delivery of Mathematics, Science, English, and other learning areas through content aligned with the strengthened Senior High School (SHS) curriculum and structured in accordance with the three-term academic calendar. These resources are intended to enhance classroom instruction and support targeted remediation efforts.
2. Now in its fourth year of implementation, the program continues to serve as a strategic teaching and learning tool that:
  - a. strengthens learners' foundational numeracy and problem-solving skills;
  - b. provides differentiated and self-paced practice aligned with the latest DepEd curriculum;
  - c. leverages real-time data to inform instruction and targeted remediation; and
  - d. supports teachers in delivering structured, competency-based instruction through blended learning approaches.
3. For School Year (SY) 2026–2027, the implementation of Khan Academy shall proceed through **two (2) distinct pathways** to ensure both depth and scale in strengthening foundational skills, while establishing clear use case scenarios to inform future policy directions and program scaling:
  - **Pathway 1: Implementation for New School Adopters**
    - The following regions—Region I, Region III, Region IV-A, Region V, Region VI, NIR, Region IX, Region X, Region XI, CARAGA, and the Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR)—shall implement Khan Academy in schools where the program is not yet in place to support structured and

coordinated adoption across the system. This pathway aims to establish clear use case scenarios and generate evidence on implementation practices. Please refer to *Annex A* for the guidelines and timeline.

- **Pathway 2: Expansion within Existing Implementing Schools in all Other Regions with Khan Academy Philippines (KA PH) Adopt-A-School Beneficiaries**

- Schools in all other regions that are currently implementing Khan Academy including the KA PH Adopt-a-School beneficiaries are encouraged to expand its utilization to additional grade levels, sections, or learning areas for SY 2026–2027. This expansion aims to capture diverse use case scenarios across varying contexts and instructional needs. Please refer to *Annex B* for the guidelines and timeline.
4. To ensure coordinated and effective implementation across all levels, all Regional Offices and Schools Division Offices are directed to **designate an official Khan Academy Focal Person** (see *Annex C* for roles and responsibilities). Each region and SDO shall issue a memorandum confirming the designation, and all focal persons are required to **attend the Training for Verification on May 13, 2026, from 1:30PM to 3:30 PM via Zoom: [www.bit.ly/khanverifytraining](http://www.bit.ly/khanverifytraining).**
  5. All implementing schools, both existing and new, shall also continue to observe Khan Academy Time at least once a week, with a minimum engagement of one class period for the subject or learning area where Khan Academy is being implemented.
  6. Participation of teaching and non-teaching personnel in authorized Khan Academy-related trainings, LAC sessions, and other official activities conducted during weekends or non-working days shall be entitled to appropriate service credits or compensatory time-off (CTO), subject to existing Civil Service Commission issuances and DepEd policies, provided such activities are duly approved, properly documented, and validated based on actual attendance.
  7. High-performing implementing teachers from SYs 2024–2025 and 2025–2026 who underwent prior capacity-building programs in partnership with the National Educators Academy of the Philippines, and are identified in *Annex D*, shall be utilized as Khan Academy Teacher Champions to strengthen regional training and implementation support for SY 2026–2027. They may be tapped for training initiatives subject to program requirements and coordination mechanisms. To prepare them for this role and enhance their capacity to facilitate in-person sessions, they shall complete the Khan Academy Teacher Champions Refresher on July 4, from 8:00 AM to 12:00 noon via this Zoom Link: [www.bit.ly/khanphchamps](http://www.bit.ly/khanphchamps)

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## ANNEX A: IMPLEMENTATION FOR NEW SCHOOL ADOPTERS (PATHWAY 1)

In support of the Department's strategic thrust to strengthen foundational literacy and numeracy and to ensure evidence-based scaling of digital learning interventions, the following regions will focus on the introduction of the program in schools where it is not yet in place, supporting structured and coordinated adoption across the system. It is designed to generate clear use case scenarios and implementation evidence to inform future scaling, while ensuring alignment in basic enabling conditions such as teacher preparation, instructional integration, monitoring, and data-informed decision-making.

- Region I
- Region III
- Region IV-A
- Region V
- Region VI
- Negros Island Region (NIR)
- Region IX
- Region X
- Region XI
- CARAGA
- Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR)

All incoming new Khan Academy schools shall undergo the standard verification process prior to implementation. Interested schools shall be required to attend the pre-verification orientation and submit the required documents and information based on the guidelines discussed during the said orientation.

### Resource and Infrastructure Mapping and Its Verification

The Regional Offices, through their designated Khan Academy Regional Focal Persons and in coordination with the respective Khan Academy Division Focal Persons, shall conduct a comprehensive survey of schools to determine:

- availability and functionality of devices (e.g. laptops, tablets, desktops);
- internet connectivity and bandwidth capacity;
- power supply stability;
- availability of a secured computer lab; and
- willingness of school administrators and teachers to implement Khan Academy.

The schools that have signified their intent to participate by signing up at [www.bit.ly/khanverify2627](http://www.bit.ly/khanverify2627) shall first undergo validation and data cleaning by the designated Khan Academy Division and Regional Focal Persons prior to the Pre-Verification Orientation on May 22. This review must be completed before the orientation to ensure that the list submitted to the Khan Academy team includes only schools that meet the minimum implementation requirements, specifically reliable internet connectivity of at least 100 Mbps and adequate device availability to support a 1:1 student-to-device ratio in the computer laboratory.

After the pre-verification orientation, schools will undergo the verification process and submit the necessary requirements through the form that will be provided. Only schools that meet the verification requirements will be included in the official list of new implementing schools for SY 2026–2027.

### Capacity Building, Program Implementation, and Monitoring

Below is the calendar of activities covering program rollout, teacher-capacity building, instructional integration, and monitoring and evaluation. Regional and Division Focal Persons shall ensure adherence to the approved schedule, timely

conduct of activities, proper documentation, and continuous coordination with Khan Academy Philippines to maintain implementation fidelity and support data-informed decision-making throughout the school year.

### **Funds for Training**

The corresponding fund source for the training of teachers shall be released through a separate issuance, as may be determined by the Learning Systems and Finance Strands. Schools Division Offices shall provide the necessary logistical support to Khan Academy, subject to applicable accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

### **Governance and Accountability**

Regional Directors and Schools Division Superintendents shall ensure the designation of Regional and Division Focal Persons who will oversee implementation, coordination, and submission of required reports. Clear lines of accountability and communication shall be maintained across governance levels to ensure timely technical assistance and effective program execution.

### **Benchmarking and National Scaling**

The Pathway I Implementation shall serve as a model for scalable national rollout. Documented best practices, operational standards, infrastructure solutions, and demonstrated learner gains from the identified regions shall guide policy refinements and inform the phased expansion of Khan Academy implementation across other regions of the country.

## ANNEX B: EXPANSION WITHIN EXISTING IMPLEMENTING SCHOOLS (PATHWAY 2)

To maximize existing technological infrastructures, strengthen instructional continuity, and expand access to data-driven digital learning tools, SY 2026-2027 shall provide for the expansion of Khan Academy implementation within existing participating schools. This pathway is intended to deepen program integration, extend coverage to additional grade levels or sections, and institutionalize effective practices developed in the previous school year/s.

Pathway 2 recognizes schools with prior implementation experience as strategic anchors for scaling, mentorship, and internal capacity-building, thereby promoting sustainability and school-level ownership of the program.

### Coverage:

This pathway covers public elementary and secondary schools in the regions not included in Pathway 1 that have previously implemented Khan Academy and are deemed ready to expand to:

- additional grade levels;
- additional class sections within the same grade level; or
- additional subject areas, where applicable and aligned with approved program scope.

To determine the appropriate type and scope of expansion for current implementing schools in SY 2026–2027, all concerned schools are directed to accomplish the required data entries through [www.bit.ly/khanverify2627](http://www.bit.ly/khanverify2627) under the tab corresponding to their respective region. The submitted data shall undergo validation and data cleaning by the designated Khan Academy Division and Regional Focal Persons to ensure accuracy and completeness, and to assess whether existing technological infrastructure and laboratory scheduling arrangements can adequately support the proposed expansion.

### Capacity Building, Program Implementation, and Monitoring

Below is the calendar of activities covering program rollout, teacher-capacity building, instructional integration, and monitoring and evaluation. Regional and Division Focal Persons shall ensure adherence to the approved schedule, timely conduct of activities, proper documentation, and continuous coordination with Khan Academy Philippines to maintain implementation fidelity and support data-informed decision-making throughout the school year.

Pathway 2 aims to institutionalize Khan Academy within participating schools by embedding its use into regular instructional planning and professional development structures. Successful expansion models, effective LAC structures, and documented learner gains shall inform future policy refinements and contribute to broader national scaling efforts.

## ANNEX C: DESIGNATION, ROLES, RESPONSIBILITIES, AND COMPETENCY FRAMEWORK OF KHAN ACADEMY FOCAL PERSONS

To ensure coherent, accountable, and high-quality implementation of Khan Academy across governance levels, the Department hereby institutionalizes the designation of Khan Academy Focal Persons at the Regional and Schools Division levels. These Focal Persons shall serve as program leads responsible for strategic oversight, coordination, technical assistance, monitoring, and data-informed supervision in support of the Department's thrust to strengthen foundational literacy and numeracy through technology-enabled instruction.

The following focal roles are established:

1. **Regional Khan Academy Focal Person (RKFP)** – designated by the Regional Director; and
2. **Division Khan Academy Focal Person (DKFP)** – designated by the Schools Division Superintendent.

The Khan Academy Focal Person is expected to demonstrate the following desirable characteristics:

- **Instructional Leadership** – demonstrates strong commitment to improving teaching and learning;
- **Data Literacy and Analytical Skills** – capable of or trainable in interpreting learner performance data and translating insights into actionable supervisory guidance;
- **Technological Proficiency** – comfortable in navigating digital platforms and promoting effective integration of educational technology;
- **Coaching and Mentoring Skills** – able to guide, support, and motivate teachers;
- **Strategic Systems Thinking** – understands program implementation within broader governance and accountability;
- **Strong Communication and Coordination Skills** – able to facilitate collaboration across schools, divisions, and regional offices as well as with Central Office and Khan Academy Philippines;
- **Commitment to Continuous Improvement** – open to innovation, reflective practice, and evidence-based program enhancement; and
- **Integrity and Accountability** – upholds transparency, accuracy in reporting, and responsible stewardship of program resources.

The designation of a Khan Academy Focal Person shall be formalized through an Office Order and shall remain effective for the duration specified therein.

### Roles and Responsibilities

#### A. Regional Khan Academy Focal Person (RKFP)

The RKFP shall:

1. Provide strategic direction and oversight for regional implementation;
2. Lead regional planning aligned with foundational skills priorities;
3. Supervise and provide technical assistance to Division Khan Academy Focal Persons;
4. Oversee regional resource and infrastructure mapping, where applicable;

5. Ensure implementation of the approved calendar of activities;
6. Analyze regional learner performance and usage data to inform program refinements; and
7. Serve as primary liaison between the Regional Office, Central Office, and Khan Academy Philippines (KA PH).

**B. Division Khan Academy Focal Person (DKFP)**

The DKFP shall:

1. Provide direct supervision and technical guidance to participating schools;
2. Assist School Heads in preparing school-level implementation or expansion plans;
3. Facilitate and monitor Learning Action Cell (LAC) sessions related to Khan Academy integration;
4. Support onboarding of newly participating teachers;
5. Monitor school-level platform usage and learner progress data;
6. Document best practices and implementation challenges; and
7. Coordinate closely with the RKFP to ensure alignment with regional targets.

The roles of the RKFP and DKFP are anchored on the Philippine Professional Standards for Supervisors (PPSS). The required competencies and expected career stage manifestations are outlined below:

The designation as Khan Academy Focal Person shall form part of the official functions of the assigned personnel and shall be reflected in their Individual Performance Commitment and Review Form (IPCRF), subject to existing policies.

Performance indicators may include:

- Timely submission and quality of reports;
- Implementation of the approved calendar of activities;
- Quality and frequency of technical assistance provided;
- Measurable increases in school participation and teacher engagement;
- Evidence of data-informed supervisory actions;
- Documentation and dissemination of best practices and innovations; and
- Demonstrable improvement in learner proficiency levels within the region or division, as evidenced by platform analytics and other standardized tests taken by the learners.
