1. Attached is Regional Memorandum No. 627, s. 2026 titled, **Menu of Agenda for the Parent-Teacher Association (PTA) Meetings for the School Year 2026-2027** to serve as guide during the conduct of their meetings during the end of term block or in any PTA engagements as deemed necessary.
2. The initiative aims to:
 - a. provide guidance to schools and PTA organizations on the key topics and strategies that may be adopted in the conduct of meetings and initiating school activities;



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- b. encourage the active involvement of parents in academic support, school governance, and community initiatives through leadership training, mentoring programs, and advisory councils;
 - c. provide an avenue to foster the school-home-community relations through worthwhile undertakings; and
 - d. mobilize education stakeholders, LGUs, and NGOs to co-create child welfare programs, volunteer initiatives, and community-based learning hubs that are aligned with the **Program PaG-UBAY** (Parents and Guardians Upholding *Bayanihan* to Assist the Young) of the Region.
3. Pursuant to DepEd Order No. 013, s. 2022 titled, **Omnibus Guidelines on the Regulation of Operations of Parent-Teacher Associations** and as stipulated in Section 10.4 of the said Order, all school-level PTA elections including Homeroom PTA (HPTA), Grade-level PTA (GrPTA), and the School PTA Board of Directors (SPTA-BOD) must be completed within thirty (30) calendar days from the first day of classes. With the official opening of classes on June 8, 2026, all school-level PTA elections must be conducted no later than **July 8, 2026**. The following timeline is therefore set:

Activity	Recommended Timeline
School-Level PTA Elections	June 8 to July 8, 2026
District / Municipal Federated PTA Elections (MFPTA)	July 9 to August 6, 2026
Division / Provincial Federated PTA Elections (PFPTA)	August 21, 2026

4. Only duly elected presidents of District or Municipal Federated PTAs are eligible to vote and run for positions in the PFPTA.
5. All PSDSs and concerned School Heads are directed to ensure strict compliance with the abovementioned deadlines and to submit summary reports of elections conducted at each level.

6. Immediate dissemination and strict compliance of this Memorandum are desired.
